## **INTRODUCTION**

The field of education is dynamic and always changing in response to the requirements of learners and improvements in pedagogical practices. Acknowledging the need of providing educators with up-to-date resources and techniques, Mar Theophilus Training College, in collaboration with Mar Gregorios Law College, is pleased to offer a groundbreaking 50 Hour Pedagogy Course for the LL. M students of Mar Gregorios College of Law from 13<sup>th</sup> to 24<sup>th</sup> November 2023. The goal of this extensive course was to provide the student participants with cutting-edge tactics, know-how, and abilities needed to succeed in the modern classroom environment.

The Course took place in Mar Theophilus Training College and a total of 18 LL. M students participated in the course. It included ten days of morning classes on a multitude of topics related to Pedagogy and afternoon sessions of the first week meant for library hours and the second week dedicated the afternoon sessions to micro-presentation of selected topics by all participants as well as an objective exam in conclusion of the Course. ## **DIARY OF EVENTS**

### **DAY- 1 [13-11-2023]**

The inauguration ceremony of the 50-hour Pedagogy Course conducted by, Mar Theophilus Training College marked a significant milestone in the pursuit of educational excellence. Held in the presence of the esteemed College Director of Mar Gregorios college of law Rev. Fr. Joseph Venmanath, the Bursar of Mar Theophilus Training College Rt. Rev. Thomas Kayyalackal and the Principal Jojo John, Mar Theophilus Training college. After the inauguration ceremony the session was started by 10.30 am by Dr Jojo John Principal of Mar Theophilus Training College on the topic 'Fundamentals of Teaching and Learning' aimed to provide us with a foundational understanding of essential pedagogical principles and strategies to enhance our teaching practices. The session was really informative and motivational, Jojo John Sir has wonderfully explained the fundamentals by using a slide presentation, the idea that he sown in our mind will grow one day and make all of us a good teacher in future. The session ended by 12:30hrs and after lunch break for one hour, Mrs. Jayasree S, the Librarian introduced us to the Reading Room and Library at Mar Theophilus Training College.

### **DAY- 2 [14-11-2023]**

The morning session was headed by Prof. Dr Reghu the Director of the M. Ed Department of Mar Theophilus Training College on the topic 'Methods of Teaching'. He started the session by understanding all of us the meaning of teaching and methods of teaching process. The session commenced with an



overview of different teaching methods, including traditional and contemporary approaches Reghu sir highlighted the importance of selecting methods aligned with learning objectives, student demographics, and the subject matter by illustrating real life experiences as examples, the session was highly interactive the practical activities help us to experience and share our thoughts and get to know the subject in to the deep. The session was ended up by 12:30 hrs and after the lunch break the students were directed to the library for preparing presentation work up to 15:00hrs.

### **DAY- 3 [15-11-2023]**

Prof Rakesh Sharma from the M. Ed Faculty of Mar Theophilus Training College, dealt the morning session on the subject matter 'Psychology of the Learner'. The goal of the session was to give us a thorough grasp of the social, emotional, and cognitive factors that affect students' learning and also discussed the role of motivation in learning and strategies to enhance student engagement. He also states about the social and emotional aspects of learning, emphasizing the impact of a positive classroom climate on academic success and asking all of us about a positive incident that made a change in our lives and session gives all of us a positive impact. The afternoon session was at the reading room and library till 15:00hrs.

### **DAY- 4 [16-11-2023]**

The morning session was headed by Dr Shafi Thompson T, Chairman of Institute of Management and Scientific Research on the topic 'Technology and Teacher', he started his session by giving a brief introduction towards the philosophy of teaching. The 'Technology and Teaching' session explored us how to integrate technology to improve pedagogical practises in a dynamic way. The main goal

was to give us the information and abilities we need to use technology in the classroom efficiently. The session covered up with the topics like misinformation, types of information disorder, benefits of technology in the classroom etc and also introduced various software that can help the teachers as well as students in learning. He also does activities in the sessions by making 3 groups and providing with questions for each group and we have to participate and share our ideas to make a classroom better with technology. The session was really a refreshing one and get know more about the technological things that we are not aware of. The session ended up by 12:45hrs and after the lunch break, all students were directed to the library till 15:00hrs.

#### **DAY- 5 [17-11-2023]**

Prof Merina led the morning session on the topic 'Principles of Motivation'. The session commenced with an exploration of prominent motivational theories, including Maslow's Hierarchy of Needs, Carl Rogers Humanistic Theory and Sigmund Freud on motivation. A central focus was on differentiating between intrinsic and extrinsic motivation. Merin Ma'am guided us in understanding how to harness both forms of motivation to optimize students' engagement. The session was really interactive and each of us was asked to share about a person or an incident that made us a kind motivation in our lives. The 'Principles of Motivation' session served as a valuable opportunity for us to refine our understanding of motivation and acquire practical tools to inspire and engage the students in the classroom.

#### **DAY-6 [20-11-2023]**

The morning session dealt with 'Teacher Competencies Today'. The class was taken by Mrs. Sindhu A. Sarah, who has an extensive experience in teaching at



St. Thomas Residential School. After completing her M.Sc. in Physics and M.Ed., she is currently pursuing Research in Education at Mar Theophilus Training College, Trivandrum. Sindhu Ma'am had effectively incorporated her subject at hand with an interactive and fun-filled session along with a lot of group activities which made the students comfortable in opening up their imaginative capabilities. With the help of a slide presentation, she explained the basic skills and know-how required for a teacher in their profession. The activities included forming groups to discuss and speak on specific questions regarding planning of an event, problem solving skills and a creative activity.

#### **DAY- 7 [21-11-2023]**

Dr. Deepthi Elizabeth Mathew, the IQAC Co-ordinator and Mathematics Professor at Mar Theophilus College of Law dealt with the topic 'Microteaching' in the morning session. Microteaching is commonly associated with teaching practice as it is conducted to improve skills of a new teacher. The span of microteaching ranges from five to ten minutes with a limited number of students as well as small content of a subject. The focus is on developing confidence and honing the skills of a teacher. Deepthi Ma'am explained the various pros of microteaching by enumerating the skills required for a teacher to conduct a class successfully and gave tips regarding the use of blackboards and questioning the students for an interactive classroom environment.

In the presence of the Principal of Mar Theophilus Training College, Prof. Dr. Joju John, the afternoon session was dedicated to micro-presentations of four student participants:

#### **DAY- 8 [22-11-2023]**

The instructor for the day, Dr. Christopher had qualified in UGC NET and JRF after completion of M. Ed. and MA Philosophy. He is also a life skill trainer and resource person who is currently working in the M. Ed Faculty of Mar Theophilus Training College. The class was on 'How to Plan a Lesson'. During the session, after providing a thorough base on learning objectives and concepts like Bloom's taxonomy and explaining the cognitive, psychomotor and affective domain, the students were given worksheets to practice writing learning objectives and preparing a lesson plan, which proved to be helpful in understanding how a teacher should plan a lesson beforehand and its importance in the teaching arena.

## **DAY- 9 [23-11-2023]**

The mentor for the morning session was the enigmatic Prof. Dr Joju John himself. He took an effective class on the 'Basics of Evaluation'. He explained that evaluation is a holistic term and that it involved transforming the qualitative data to quantitative and thereby aiding in recording progress of students while also helping to ascertain what they should focus more on. The students were given introduction to concepts like IQ and EQ and its relevance in the modern classroom. Prof. Joju also enumerated the methods to frame a question paper, giving importance to the weightage of questions and the format by which a question paper shall be made in consideration with simple language and economical means in conducting an exam. He summed up by giving a short talk on attitude scale, interest inventory and personality inventory which includes the Rorschach test.

The instructor for the morning session was led by Dr. Rasmi M, an exceptionally talented educator on the topic 'Principles of Classroom Management'. Rasmi

Ma'am led an effective and interactive session with the students. The printed notes were handed over to the students for personal use. Moreover, she also printed out seven case studies in order to read and provide solutions in relation to classroom management. Each problem was discussed and segregated in the heads of individual or group management as per the problems at hand. Rasmi Ma'am had explained the tips and tricks to handle the decorum of a class and how to communicate with the students in a meaningful and effective manner.

After the class, a small objective exam was conducted in the span of about an hour with forty questions related to the entire course.

At about 14:00hrs, a Valedictory Session was conducted in the presence of the dignitaries Fr. Adv Joseph Venmanath, Director of Mr Gregorios College of Law, Fr. Adarsh Kumbalath, Bursar at Mar Gregorios College of Law, Manoj Krishna A, In-Charge of LL.
